

## **Combination Action**

100 level solid state

In June of 2004, the process of acquiring a new organ for St. Barnabas began with a gift of \$300,000 toward the purchase of a new organ. Our existing organ, a Moeller Artiste was beyond its useful life and needed extensive repair that could not be justified given the cost that would be required. The 2004 vestry approved receipt of the gift and chartered our music director, Paul Roy, to create an organ search committee with the goal of selecting and commissioning a builder by June 2005. This committee was formed and began work in fall of 2004.

Visits were made locally and to Oregon, Washington, DC, Maryland and Virginia to narrow down the list of builders and to refine the stop list that would be necessary to provide St. Barnabas with decades (if not centuries!) of music. In June of 2005 Richard Bond Organs of Portland, Oregon was selected with approval by the vestry.

The final budget for the organ including the minimum stop list to match the space in the sanctuary, taxes and the costs to remove the existing organ and prepare the space for the new organ was about \$480,000. A pledge drive to raise the remaining funds began and was called The Gabriel Project.

Every gift regardless of the amount will be an important part of the realization of our dream for the new organ. We look forward to the involvement of the entire parish family.
