SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN AGES 1-11 is offered at 9:50am each Sunday. Drop-off is in the library (please ask an usher for directions). At St Barnabas, children participate in Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum designed to immerse children in Bible stories where they can experience God, discover and explore their innately spiritual nature, and wonder together about the marvelous things God is doing! WE WELCOME ALL CHILDREN IN CHURCH, and we expect them to be children! We also know that sometimes parents become uncomfortable with extreme wiggles, giggles, howls or hollers. We stream live audio from the church into the Parlor, so you won't miss a thing. There are Kid's Bags in the church entry, filled with crayons, puzzles and pictures to color. You'll also find a nursery at the end of the hallway, where there are rocking chairs and lots of amusement for little ones.

Did you know?

- ◆ Americans give most generously to religion, followed by education. According to Giving USA 2018, last year giving to religion increased 2.9% from 2017 giving levels.
- ◆ The greatest indicator of philanthropy is religious faith and/or affiliation; 75% of all donations come from religious motivation.
- ◆ St. Barnabas was one of the early apostles; in Acts we find the story of Barnabas selling his land and giving the proceeds to the community. (Acts 4:36-37)
- ◆ The annual assessment to the Diocese of Olympia has been reduced in the past few years, while continuing to increase support for congregations and clergy, faith formation across ages and cultures, and Global Mission Work.
