SAY HI TO DALE WALKER AND BRIAN OLDHAM

Parishioner Judy Tingley is interviewing parishioners and helping them to share a bit of their stories with us. This is the first in her series of stories - look forward to more of them in the future. Thanks, Judy, for helping us get to know each other a bit better!

Several years ago, Brian Oldham and his wife Dale Walker made a pilgrimage to Ireland, searching through the clover for their ancestries. Along the path they met up with Celtic Spirituality - and were enchanted.

No wonder Brian wants to bring St. Brigid of Ireland to Saint Barnabas on February 3rd so we may vicariously enjoy knowing more about her and each other. Brigid became the first Celtic goddess and later, a nun and Saint associated with home and hearth and elevated skills: understanding psychology, reading high literature, telling tales about the seasons, nature, work, family and times.

Dale is from the South; her people are from Mississippi and Arkansas. She received a degree in Electrical Engineering from Rice University in Houston, Texas, and then moved to California to take her first job. Brian was raised near water, living on Alameda, Coronado and Treasure Islands, which is perhaps part of the reason he chose living on this island.

Dale and Brian met through shared interests and mutual friends and became friends. After a few years they began dating and married in 2001. They solved a potential gap between Brian's Catholicism and Dale's Presbyterianism at St Paul's Episcopal Church in Oakland, a "great crossroads of Catholicism and Protestantism." They spent several years in Portland before they found Bainbridge Island and are glad to be here and closer to the water.

Now Dale is immersed at the BARN with fiber arts, embroidery, learning to weave and sewing. She is the coordinator of volunteers for Fiber Studio there and shows up most days. Both Brian and Dale hope to see you **TONIGHT at 5 PM** in the parish hall to tell stories of life, love and adventure and pretend it's early spring with St. Brigid.

SALON NIGHTS: MORE THAN A MONTH

Salon Nights bring community members together so that we can discuss our thoughts about issues related to social justice and diversity of human experience, both of which are main concerns of MAC. We just talk, listen, question, and share as we puzzle through these challenging issues - together. Our starting points for discussion are documentaries and below is a list of our upcoming films.

Please join us. All films are free.

Partnering with BIMA's celebration of Black History, this Salon Night screens a movie by an African-American filmmaker who questions the idea of a Black History Month. He suggests that limiting Black History to just one month denigrates rather than elevates the topic and that Black History should not be conceptualized or taught as separate from US Cultural History. In particular, he looks at how the problematic nature of Black History Month relates to education, history, identity, and commercialization. Join us **Sunday February 10th at 2pm at BIMA.**
