WE WELCOME ALL CHILDREN IN CHURCH, and we expect them to be children!

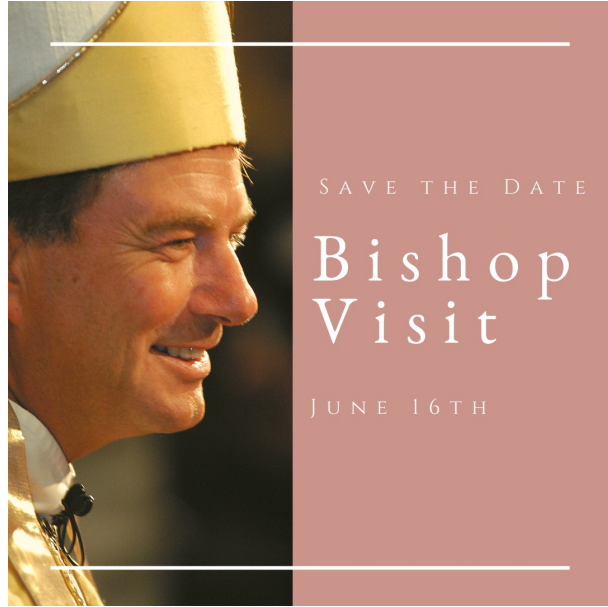

BISHOP RICKEL WILL BE WITH US IN JUNE!



Be sure to mark your calendars for Sunday June 16th and join us for Bishop Rickel's visitation! The Bishop is with us only once every three years and we know you won't want to miss him. In addition to hearing him preach, one of the most special things about the Bishop's visitation is the opportunity to be Baptized, Confirmed or Received into the Episcopal Church right here at St Barnabas.

Bishop Rickel stands in the apostolic succession that began with Jesus laying hands on Peter who laid hands on others and made them bishops, who laid hands on others and made them bishops and so on throughout time. Bishops are the successors to the apostles whose authority is derived by an unbroken succession in the ministry and laying on of hands. Having the opportunity to have those hands laid on you in Baptism, Confirmation or Reception is a gift we hope you will accept.

If you are a baptized person who has been confirmed in the Catholic or Lutheran Church, you may be Received in the Episcopal Church. Others may be Baptized or Confirmed. Preparation for Confirmation, Reception and Adult Baptism will be held on Sundays in May at 1PM. Children's baptism preparation happens apart from this series.

SAFEGUARDING GOD'S CHILDREN AND SAFEGUARDING GOD'S PEOPLE REQUIRED TRAININGS OFFERED JUNE 2 & JUNE 9

Our Church takes its responsibility for the safety of our people seriously. The Safe Church program teaches us how to identify and prevent abuse within the church community, and is conducted several times per year, free of charge. The training consists of two sessions: Safeguarding God's Children and Safeguarding God's People.

Safeguarding God's Children is required for all clergy and people who have a key to the church facility or who have the lock-box code. Vestry members, church staff, and anyone who works with children in any capacity are also required to take the Safeguarding God's Children training.

Safeguarding God's People is required for all clergy and people who have a key to the church facility or who have the lock-box code. Vestry members, church staff, and parish or Eucharistic Visitors are also required to take the Safeguarding God's People training.

It is recommended that both trainings be taken in person. Safeguarding God's Children will be offered on June 2 at noon in the parish hall, and Safeguarding God's People will be offered on June 9 at noon in the parish hall. Bring your lunch and plan to spend about two hours.

Please note that the lock box code will be changed on June 10 and in order to receive the new code, you will need to have registered for trainings sometime before September 1.
