SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN AGES 4-11 is offered at 9:50am each Sunday. Drop-off is in the library (please ask an usher for directions). At St Barnabas, children participate in Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum designed to immerse children in Bible stories where they can experience God, discover and explore their innately spiritual nature, and wonder together about the marvelous things God is doing! WE WELCOME ALL CHILDREN IN CHURCH, and we expect them to be children! We also know that sometimes parents become uncomfortable with extreme wiggles, giggles, howls or hollers. We stream live audio from the church into the Parlor, so you won't miss a thing. There are Kid's Bags in the church entry, filled with crayons, puzzles and pictures to color. Princie and Bob moved to Bainbridge Island three years ago after living 45 years in the same house in Connecticut; a colonial house on six acres. Bob had a John Deere tractor and thoroughly enjoyed mowing

those six acres! The magnet for their move from their ideal life in the East to the West was three children and eight grandchildren, ages from four to sixteen. They also were ready to retire; a good time to be closer to their family, all of whom live on the West Coast.

Bob worked all his life in the financial world as a bond trader and money manager. He was on the Conservation Committee for the Town of Easton and Treasurer for their church. Princie was president of the local Land Trust, which served 4 towns in the area. She also was a board member for the leading environmental advocacy organizations in Connecticut, known as The Connecticut Fund for the Environment and Save Long Island Sound.

As they thought about retirement, Bob and Princie chose the Pacific Northwest and were charmed by Seattle. They liked the cultural environment, the University of Washington, the Symphony, lectures, the interesting assets and dynamics of an urban environment.

They had been on Bainbridge Island traveling to visit their son, who lives in Port Townsend. Driving across the island, they both responded to the beautiful trees, all of the varied shades of green along the roadways, the small town feeling and calm aura.
