SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN AGES 4-11 is offered at 9:50am each Sunday during the school year. Drop-off is in the library (please ask an usher for directions). At St Barnabas, children participate in Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum designed to immerse children in Bible stories where they can experience God, discover and explore their innately spiritual nature, and wonder together about the marvelous things God is doing! WE WELCOME ALL CHILDREN IN CHURCH, and we expect them to be children! We also know that sometimes parents become uncomfortable with extreme wiggles, giggles, howls or hollers. We stream live audio from the church into the Parlor, so you won't miss a thing. There are Kid's Bags in the church entry, filled with crayons, puzzles and pictures to color. Chaplains on the Harbor, an update from Steve Schmitz and Chaplain's Organizer Aaron Scott

By now we hope you know that Chaplains on the Harbor has leased several acres of farmland and is raising fruits and vegetables that are sold to community members in Westport and Aberdeen. A very generous parishioner from St Barnabas (who wishes to remain anonymous) recently made a donation to Harbor Roots Farm that enabled the farm to acquire a farm van! The van came at harvest time and allows Harbor Roots farmers to get their vegetables and fruits to market. In the off-season the van will be used for retreat and other Diocesan event transportation. In summary, the Harbor Roots Farm team is going full throttle!

Chaplains on the Harbor recently received a new stove and is currently providing Eucharist, food, clean clothes, showers, and occasional sleeping accommodations for the homeless people in the area. The most immediate concern is pastoral care for residents of Grays Harbor County's largest homeless encampment situated along the Chehalis River in Aberdeen. The ongoing presence in the camps of clergy and lay people from around the diocese has encouraged a new tone of courtesy and helpfulness from the City, which has offered the people of the encampment time to relocate to a parking lot at City Hall rather than simply clearing (sweeping) the encampment without offering an alternative. While the situation is improving, there are over 1,000 homeless people in Aberdeen and Westport and not nearly that number of tent sites available to them. We ask you to join us in praying for the good people in Grays Harbor and that this situation be resolved. Thank you, parishioners of St. Barnabas, for all you have given! Look for our Chaplains on the Harbor food drive in the fall.
