At St Barnabas, children participate in Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum designed to immerse children in Bible stories where they can experience God, discover and explore their innately spiritual nature, and wonder together about the marvelous things God is doing! 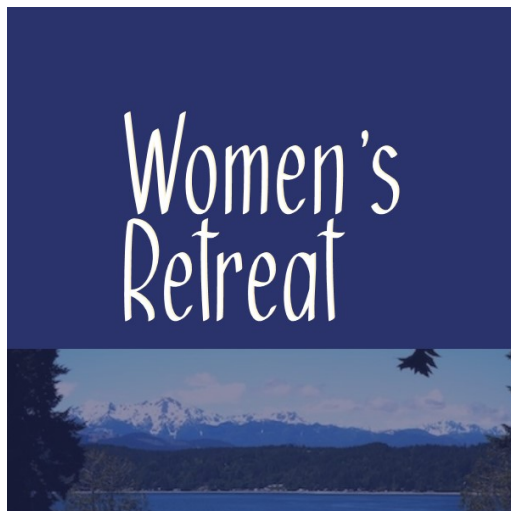

For decades, child welfare authorities have been removing Native American children from their homes to save them from being Indian. In Maine, the first official "truth and reconciliation commission" in the United States begins a historic investigation. Dawnland goes behind-the-scenes as this historic body grapples with difficult truths, redefines reconciliation, and charts a new course for state and tribal relations. Post-screening speakers: Marilyn Wandry, Suquamish Tribal Elder who has lived her whole life in this area and whose parents were sent to local boarding schools. Angee Harrington, Suquamish Tribal member who works at the Suquamish Museum as a tour guide and in Collections.
