At St Barnabas, children participate in Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum designed to immerse children in Bible stories where they can experience God, discover and explore their innately spiritual nature, and wonder together about the marvelous things God is doing! CHAPLAINS ON THE HARBOR

As we approach the fall season, the Outreach Committee is happy to update you with the work of Chaplains on the Harbor and the work of The Reverend Sarah Monroe. Rev. Sarah who leads Chaplains on the Harbor in Aberdeen/Westport is in her fourth year.

Unlike St. Barnabas where the congregation comes to a church, the Chaplains on the Harbor meet people on the streets of Aberdeen/Westport and visit homeless camps outside of town. Currently, Rev. Sarah and her team of volunteers hold services in a Westport building that used to house St. Christopher's Episcopal Church. Additionally, meals, showers and clean clothes are offered to over 350 members of the community.

Recently, Rev. Sarah has hired two former Chaplains on the Harbor volunteers, one to assist with pastoral care and a jail program, and another to help with grant writing and the development of a commercial kitchen for job training. St. Barnabas has proudly supported Chaplains on the Harbor for 6 years and has seen the program help many within the community.
