GETTING TO KNOW JOE SALTER

Parishioner Judy Tingley is interviewing parishioners and helping them to share a bit of their stories with us. This is the sixth in her series of stories - look forward to more of them in the future. Thanks, Judy, for helping us get to know each other a bit better! July Tingley and Joe Salter collaborated on this article about Joe.



Joe comes from a family full of Episcopal clergy but he somehow managed to avoid becoming a priest himself. His father was a priest and was rector of St. John's Olympia and Christ Church Puyallup when Joe was growing up. His grandfather was a priest. His mother's older sister married a priest; Joe's uncle later became a bishop. And two

of Joe's cousins are priests and one of them also became a bishop. As for Joe's own involvement in the church, he was an acolyte as a youth, served on the vestry of a large parish in Dallas during the 1990s and readily admits that there have been periods of his life where he wasn't regularly in a pew.

Joe graduated from UW and went on to get a master's degree from the Thunderbird School of Global Management in Phoenix, Arizona. He taught in a university foreign study program in Guadalajara, Mexico and then returned to Seattle and began a long career in human resources management with companies in the Puget Sound region as well as in Southern California and Texas. He retired in 2015.

Joe moved to Bainbridge Island from Kirkland last summer and jokes that he followed Rev. Karen here after getting to know her at St. Thomas Medina, where he was a member and she was one of the clergy. Joe has actually considered the island a second home for decades; he has had family here for more than 40 years. His mother spent the last several years of her life at Madison House and got to know Deacon Dan well through his regular visits there.

Joe is a lifelong bachelor and enjoys spending time with his two sisters and their families. He volunteers at Bloedel Reserve and says he loves exploring the island's many miles of trails.

PRESIDING BISHOP CURRY URGES CONGRESS TO CO-SPONSOR THE GRACE ACT. WE CAN TOO!

World Refugee Day, which occurs every year on June 20, is a time to celebrate the resilience, courage, and strength of refugees worldwide while also urging our elected officials to welcome refugees. This World Refugee Day, ask your members of Congress to co-sponsor the GRACE Act: The Guaranteed Refugee Admissions Ceiling Enhancement Act, S.1088 & H.R.2146.

This bill would ensure that the U.S. maintains its historic commitment to resettling refugees by requiring that the President set the number of refugees the U.S. will resettle in a given fiscal year at a floor of 95,000. The average number of refugees that U.S. presidents have authorized to be resettled in a fiscal year between 1980 and 2017 has been 95,000. Over the past few years, this number has dropped dramatically, such that this year, the President authorized only 30,000 refugees to come to the U.S. In an effort to maintain U.S. leadership and to ensure the U.S. remains equipped to respond to global crises through refugee resettlement, the bill would also mandate quarterly reports on refugee admissions, increasing transparency, accountability, and oversight.

"When we welcome the stranger, we welcome the Lord God himself. We welcome Jesus," commented Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop and Primate Michael B. Curry in his 2019 World Refugee Day Message. "On World Refugee Day, pray, learn about refugees, learn about what you can do, and do whatever you can to help the strangers in our midst."
