
GLUTEN FREE EUCHARISTIC HOSTS are available for those who need them. Please ask the priest at communion.

The Diocesan Assessment – What It Is And Isn't!

As Episcopalians, we are a part of a diocese, something much bigger than just our parish. As you likely know, the word Episcopal means "Bishop." Bishops serve as the chief pastor of the diocese, as pastor to your pastors. Their work is that of oversight and unification – unifying the diocese and serving as a symbol of the unity of the wider church. We are Episcopalians, a parish of the Diocese of Olympia, united under our Bishop. It has been said that the smallest unit in the Episcopal Church is the Diocese, not the parish.

As an Episcopal Church, we are a part of a diocese and we both rely on and contribute to our diocese. We are not a congregational church, reliant on and responsible for only our own congregation. The Diocese of Olympia is made up of many congregations, some larger than St Barnabas, and some smaller. The people in these parishes love their churches just as much as we love ours and some of them are struggling to keep their doors open. Because we pay an assessment, we are helping to keep those struggling churches open. Chaplains on the Harbor receives money from our parishioners, but they receive much more from the diocese because of the many churches contributing to the diocesan assessment.

Our church has received funds from diocesan assessments as well. St Barnabas received a \$30,000 grant from the diocese to help open the commercial kitchen. Those funds came from assessed dollars. We've been awarded two more Congregational Development grants, also from assessed dollars, since the beginning of 2018. Priests and deacons are able to attend conferences for sabbath, collegiality and new learning because of assessed dollars. And our Diocesan offices run as a result of assessed dollars.

Some people think St Barnabas is funded by "the church." But WE ARE the church, and WE fund the church. Our parishioners give out of gratitude and generous spirits and we share some of that money with the wider church in order to take our place in creating a diocese that is rich in love, compassion and justice for us all.
