SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN AGES 4-11 is offered at 9:50am each Sunday during the school year. Drop-off is in the library (please ask an usher for directions). At St Barnabas, children participate in Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum designed to immerse children in Bible stories where they can experience God, discover and explore their innately spiritual nature, and wonder together about the marvelous things God is doing! WE WELCOME ALL CHILDREN IN CHURCH, and we expect them to be children! We also know that sometimes parents become uncomfortable with extreme wiggles, giggles, howls or hollers. We stream live audio from the church into the Parlor, so you won't miss a thing. There are Kid's Bags in the church entry, filled with crayons, puzzles and pictures to color. Getting to know Tom & Kathy

Parishioner Judy Tingley is interviewing parishioners and helping them to share a bit of their stories with us. This is the seventh in her series of stories - look forward to more of them in the future. Thanks, Judy, for helping us get to know each other a bit better!



Tom grew up happily in southern, middle Tennessee in a small town surrounded by numerous extended family members. Throughout his childhood he worshiped in the local Church of Christ, founded by his grandfather.

Tom fondly remembers his days growing up. "I had a wonderful childhood, good parents, and a cool lake for swimming in the summer. There was nothing to complain about, except "my Grandma Baker could be pretty wicked with her wooden spoon. I learned real early to behave myself!"

Tom spent his adult years in the Nashville metropolitan area, working in the engineering department for the City of Murfreesboro. After his career as a city project manager, Tom utilized his skills at a private construction company, supervising the building of all types of infrastructure: streets, highways, bridges, water, stormwater and sewer lines. When laid off due to the financial crash in 2008, he cared for his mother for nine months as she convalesced after open-heart surgery. Tom now uses his engineering, construction and pastoral skills serving as Sexton and all around helper to the St Barnabas community.

A move to Oklahoma and a new job turned out to be much more exciting than expected as Oklahoma was the place Kathy and Tom met! 'Twas Kismet - and perhaps, they say, God's work.

Kathy was born in Phoenix and worshipped with her family at beautiful All Saints Episcopal Church on Central Avenue. When she was ten, the family moved to Bend, Oregon. Having seen snow only once before in her life, Kathy was pretty sure she was going to freeze to death. After somehow surviving the Bend winters, she went on to put herself through undergraduate and law school in Portland.
