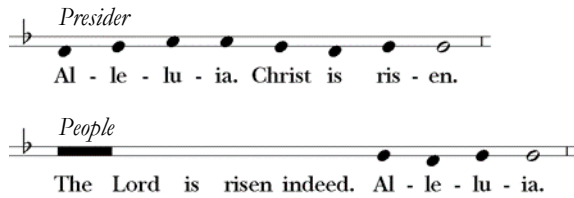

And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.





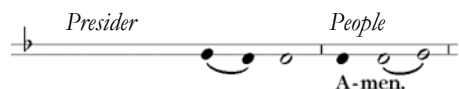
Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

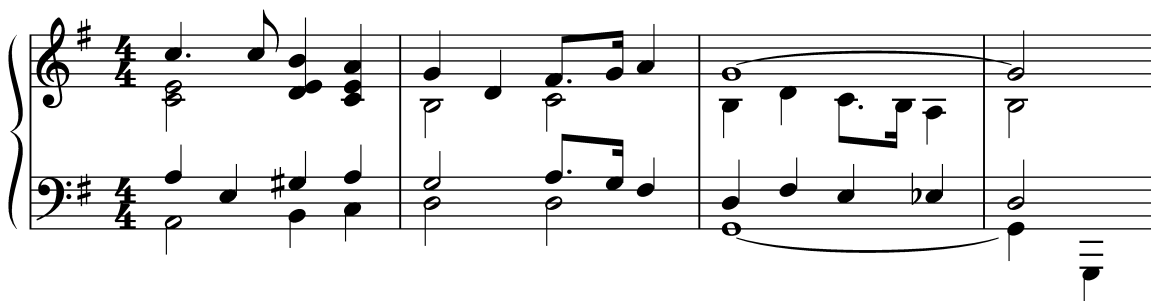
