# THE FIRST READING

READER: A Reading from the Wisdom of Solomon.

Wisdom 3:1-9

The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be a disaster, and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace. For though in the sight of others they were punished, their hope is full of immortality. Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself; like gold in the furnace he tried them, and like a sacrificial burnt offering he accepted them. In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and will run like sparks through the stubble. They will govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will reign over them forever. Those who trust in him will understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his holy ones, and he watches over his elect.





Presider and People

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

For the absolution and remission of all our sins and offences, things done and left undone, let us pray to the **Lord...have mercy.** 

That we may respect all created beings, live gently on the earth, and discern the divine beauty in all things visible and invisible, let us pray to the **Lord...have mercy.** 

That the Spirit may transform us into our full humanity in Christ, free at last to love and serve and risk everything for the sake of the Kingdom, let us pray to the **Lord...have mercy.** 

In thanksgiving for the saints we have known, all those who have reflected Christ's light for us, let us pray to the **Lord...have mercy.** 

For all the faithful departed, that they may rejoice in the communion of your everlasting presence, let us pray to the **Lord...have mercy.** 

Rejoicing in communion with the ever-blessed Mother of Jesus, Barnabas, and those in every generation in whom Christ has been honored, we praise you, Love who loves us. For when we ask, you give; when we seek, you show the way; when we knock, you open. Praise to you for your unfailing grace. Make us now your faithful people, we pray in the name of Christ. **Amen.**





#### THE GREAT THANKSGIVING




It is truly right to glorify you, Father, and to give you thanks; for you alone are God, living and true, dwelling in light inaccessible from before time and for ever.

We acclaim you, holy God, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might live in just relation with all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation. Gracious and merciful God, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent the incarnate Word to be our Savior. By the power of the Holy Spirit, your servant Mary conceived and bore a son: Jesus, the holy child of God.

He lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for the One who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete Christ's work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for Jesus to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

O divine Source, giver of every blessing, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

O Fount of all being, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them, and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

Remember, O God, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember our Presiding Bishop Michael, our Provisional Bishop Melissa, and all who minister in your Church. Remember all your people, and those who seek your truth. Remember the beloved souls whose names we have spoken this morning. Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light.

And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, matriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, with Barnabas and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Word made flesh, Jesus Christ our Savior.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty Father, now and forever.




And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,






